ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE CENTER

The ESL Center is located on the first floor of the Library and Technology Center. THE ESL Center offers computer-centered self-paced programs with help available from ESL faculty or native-speaking tutors during regular ESL Center hours. Non-native English-speaking students can work on GRAMMAR, WRITING, READING, VOCABULARY, PRONUNCIATION, LISTENING, and TOEFL preparation. ESL students who need help with assignments from other MPC classes are also welcome at the ESL Center.

Students may enroll anytime throughout the semester. Each one-half unit of credit in ENSL 300 requires 25.5 hours of work in the ESL Center. ENSL 300 may be taken for up to 1.5 units this semester.
