**Course Title:**           **CHEM 1A: GENERAL CHEMISTRY I**

**Scheduled Time:**       Thursday, 2-5 pm and 6-9 pm

**Start & End Dates:**   August 27<sup>th</sup> through December 20<sup>th</sup>

**Course Descriptions:** This is the first course of a two-semester sequence. Sequence covers atomic structure, chemical bonding, introduction to bio-organic chemistry, thermodynamics, kinetics, equilibrium and electrochemistry. You will share the teaching responsibility in teaching two of the four laboratories per week, as scheduled above.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Master's in chemistry **OR**
- Bachelor's in chemistry or biochemistry **AND** master's in biochemistry, chemical engineering, chemical physics, physics, molecular biology, or geochemistry **OR**
- The equivalent. (Applicant must submit equivalency form.)

**AND**

- Sensitivity to and understanding of the diverse academic, socioeconomic, gender, cultural, disability, and ethnic backgrounds of community college students.

**CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:**

- Teaching assignments are part-time and temporary in nature. Assignments are subject to Governing Board approval, adequate enrollment size, and assignment to a contract instructor.
- Offer and assignment of employment is subject to verification of all information provided on the employment application, credential, transcripts, fingerprint check, and tuberculosis examination as required.
- Salary Rate: \$46.22-\$56.44 per hour, based on education
