Besides programs offered on the main campus, students in the Basic Police Academy and the Basic Fire Academy can complete at least 50% of their credits for a certificate or degree at an off-campus site located on Colonel Durham Road in Seaside. These programs moved to this site in spring 2007. These two programs are currently housed in two classrooms that are being leased at the Monterey College of Law.

On July 24, 2007 MPC entered into an agreement with Farmworkers Institute of Education and Leadership Development (FIELD) to offer non-credit ESL classes.

a) which courses or instructional programs are provided

The courses taught by FIELD are entry level English as a Second Language courses (e.g. ENSL 425). These are some of the same courses taught by the on-campus ENSL department.

b) which support services are provided

According to our agreement with FIELD, they will provide outreach and recruitment, assessment, student follow up and orientation services to students in the Basic Skills and English as a Second Language programs covered by our agreement. As necessary, MPC provides training for FIELD staff in how to conduct assessment and will provide all necessary materials for the assessment process. The cost of providing these services is paid for by MPC as part of the instructional agreement that we have with FIELD.

c) the level of control the institution exercises over the contract

The college ensures quality control by reviewing instructor credentials for minimum qualifications.

The college has also conducted site visits at various locations to view actual instruction. In addition, staff has worked with FIELD to ensure that instructors are provided appropriate professional development.
